The European Union holds a regional seminar on “States and International Arbitration” for Central Asian Specialists

TASHKENT – In the framework of the Rule of Law Initiative of the European Union for Central Asia, a seminar on international arbitration will take place in Tashkent on 19 May 2017, with support from the European Union and the Ministry of Justice of Uzbekistan.

The objective of the seminar is to create a dialogue and exchange of experience among members of the Central Asian and European communities of arbitrators, and to share advanced European expertise about the institutions and procedures of international arbitration in particular, with the objective of securing cross-border investment and facilitating the resolution of economic disputes opposing mainly Central Asian States or State-owned companies and international investors.

High-level specialists from the Ministry of Justice and legal specialists of other ministries, state agencies, and leading companies, lawyers and academics of Kazakhstan, the Kyrgyz Republic, Tajikistan, Turkmenistan and Uzbekistan will engage in a dialogue on best international -primarily European- regulations and practices along with experts from Belgium, France, Latvia and the Netherlands especially. The seminar will aim at ensuring legal security for investment, improving the business climate and enabling sustainable economic development in the five Central Asian States.

At the Fourth Conference on Rule of Law (Astana, 14-15 October 2015), the Ministers of Justice of the EU and Central Asia “*encouraged the development of alternative methods of dispute resolution*” and “*noted that international investment may only develop if a stable level-playing field is established for business activities, including amongst other regulations and practices*”.

The EU-Central Asia Rule of Law Platform project acts as a support mechanism to facilitate policy dialogue and promote the measures contributing to legal reforms in each of the Central Asian countries. The Platform is being funded by the European Union to the amount of EUR 1,8 million and is implemented by IBF International Consulting.
